ince 1958, the Daughters of Charity have cared for the needs of the mostly Hispanic population on the south side of San Antonio and Bexar County. Three-fourths of our clients live in working households, have low wage jobs with no benefits, and cannot afford basic human services.

Daughters of Charity Services provides safe, bilingual, and educationally sound child development programs at DePaul Children's Center and DePaul-Wesley Children's Center (opened in August 2013), Monday-Friday, 6:30 a.m. to 6:00 p.m. for 330 children ages six weeks through 12 years. A heavy emphasis is placed on learning, socialization with other children, and teaching good nutrition.



La Misión Family Health Care is a medical clinic providing primary care medical services. The most common ailments treated are diabetes, cardiovascular disease, and infections. Simple diagnostic tests and medications are also available through the clinic. When needed, we can link patients with specialty services at the University Health System. La Misión Family Health Care also provides comprehensive dental services, including preventive dentistry, restorations, extractions, and root canals.

DePaul Family Center and La Misión Family Health Care offer a variety of social services, including crisis intervention, home visits, benefits assistance, advocacy, counseling, monetary and emergency help, and food and clothing assistance.

El Carmen Wellness Center has programs that enhance skills needed to manage health and make good lifestyle choices. These programs are particularly effective for the large number of our patients who have chronic diseases.






MEDICAL, DENTAL, SOCIAL SERVICES, CHILD CARE, WELLNESS SERVICES JULY 2013 - JUNE 2014


We operate five health and social service centers: DePaul Family Center- (social services and counseling, diabetic and nutrition classes, food/clothing pantry); DePaul Children's Center and DePaul-Wesley Children's Center (early childhood education, behavioral counseling, parenting programs, after-school care); La Misión Family Health Care (primary medical care, dental care, social services, health education, preventive services, counseling); El Carmen Wellness Center (exercise and fitness programs, nutrition and diabetic education). Eighty-five percent of the clients we serve fall at or below 150 percent of the federal poverty level.


Daughters of Charity Services is part of Ascension Health, the nation's largest non-profit Catholic health-care system. Most Ascension affiliates are hospitals; Daughters of Charity Services is one of five community health ministries. We have a local, independent Board of Trustees, a Senior Leadership Team of department and program directors overseeing approximately 135 full- and part-time employees distributed over our five service locations. We have approximately 50 regular volunteers and 300 seasonal volunteers.


