S ister Consuelo is the Director of Mission Integration at Daughters of Charity Services of San Antonio. She promotes the mission of DCSSA with community collaborators and partners. Her passion: to make a difference in the lives of families living in poverty.

Question: Tell me about some of the ways you bring the DCSSA mission to the community who are unaware of what we do.



**Sister Consuelo:** I think our living in the community where we serve helps us bring our mission in a unique way. First we have the same experience that the people we serve have: we live with the same problems they do. We live in an area that is economically segregated

and so we know the issues and problems they have; for instance, in renovating their homes, in finding affordable grocery stores within walking distances; having a consistent San Antonio Fear Free Environment (SAFFE) unit officer in the neighborhood. We have a clearer lens for understanding the needs of the people we serve. (Continued on page 2)

And that helps me be able to recruit time, talent and treasure from donors and benefactors and corporations, who become collaborators and partners in mission but

also from parishioners and interfaith neighbors who want to participate and share in the mission of giving.

Q: What part of your ministry do you find challenging after almost 50 years as a Daughter?

**SC:** I've been a Daughter of Charity for 48 years! What I find challenging and exhilarating, in my ministry and in the work I do, is bringing diverse people together and engaging them to dream together, conspire



together and to use their creative juices to improve the lives of our vulnerable brothers and sisters.

#### Q: What are some ways we can make an impact in the lives of those around us?

SC: The most impact we can have in the lives of those we serve is by being more present and attentive to the persons who come seeking assistance from us, and this can begin with something as simple as a smile. People simply need to have their dignity as a person be recognized and respected. St.

Vincent de Paul once said "It is only because of your love that the poor will forgive you the bread you give them." And for those of us in the Vincentian Tradition, we know that treating each person with kindness and love is the first thing we do, and then whatever assistance we are able to provide is secondary.

# Navigating the Affordable Care Act

pen enrollment for the Affordable Care Act's Health Insurance Marketplace is happening now. Beginning November 1<sup>st</sup>, the Daughters of Charity Navigator team will assist consumers who seek to enroll in a plan for calendar year 2017. The team, funded by a grant from the federal government, serves Bexar, Atascosa, Karnes, Wilson and DeWitt counties.

The Affordable Care Act enables people who do not have access to an insurance plan through their employers to shop for a policy from a menu of plans offered by private insurance companies. The healthcare reform law has many important



features but one of the most notable is that people with pre-existing health conditions such as diabetes or cancer cannot be denied coverage and their premiums are the same as those who are healthy. People with low to moderate incomes receive subsidies to pay most or a sizable portion of the monthly premium. Copayments for qualifying individuals and families with lower incomes are reduced substantially.

Last year 1.2 million Texans enrolled in Marketplace plans with 68% of those paying less than \$100 per month for their insurance premiums.

All Navigator assistance is free. Those seeking help can call 210-334-2335 or toll free 1-844-293-2335 for an appointment. Navigators are available at most of the libraries in the area as well as at the DePaul Family Center and La Misión Family Health Care, operated by the Daughters of Charity Services of San Antonio.

For the last 21 years, our numbers have grown to meet the needs of almost 10,000 children total. This year alone, the members of the St. Vincent de Paul community sponsored 300 students, ensuring each child could walk into the new school year with confidence.

"It isn't just supplies our families need," Adele explains. "It's underwear; it's socks, it's shoes and clothes. For our families, a new pair of shoes may not be feasible, so we hope to help them worry a little less." While many organizations focus on pencils, calculators, or notebooks, Daughters of Charity Services understands the complete picture.

Through the immense generosity of the San Antonio community and our partners, Adopt-A-Child exceeded its



goal of assisting 600 children.

With 21 successful years behind us, we look forward to continuing our mission for many years to come.
