Sister Irma Vargas, DC, Community Outreach Worker in the Social Services Department, contacted Cindy Wineland, Coordinator of SSISD counselors to arrange an orientation session and tour for the school staff members who are most likely to be aware of physical and mental health needs of students.

"We wanted to develop a relationship with the school staff because we are so close to several SSISD schools," said Sister Irma. "Last year one of the counselors called asking if we could help with toiletries for four seniors who were homeless because their parents had kicked them out. They were 'couch surfing' at friends' houses. We want to increase awareness of what we have to offer to support the counselors and nurses that work with troubled students. By the way, all four of those students graduated," she concluded with a smile.

The program opened with Gracie Molina, Director of Clinical Services; Sister Consuelo Tovar, DC, Director of Mission Integration; and Sister Pat Connolly, DC, Licensed Professional Counselor, welcoming the group of over 30 attendees. # Handmade rosaries comfort children far from home

During August, when many unaccompanied youth from Central America were being transferred from temporary housing at Joint Base San Antonio-Lackland, they left with a handmade rosary around their necks or tightly clutched in their hands.

"We learned from Father Richard Simoure at St. Clare Catholic Church that the children were asking for rosaries," explained Sister Laureana Perez, DC. "The Rosary Ministry at Holy Trinity Catholic Church meets regularly to make rosaries. The handmade rosaries are unbreakable, each secured with a tough cord, ready for any trip the child may be taking."

Within two days, thanks to Holy Trinity Rosary Ministry volunteers, 200 rosaries were delivered and distributed to children at the shelter by Fr. Richard. "The children can hold and hope their rosary will keep them safe," said Sister Laureana. "Even if the child doesn't know how to pray a rosary, it's the symbolism, especially for Hispanic Catholics – a connection they have with parents and grandparents while they are here and so alone."

This grant will strengthen the program in two specific ways: first, by increasing support to families and children in the area of behavioral and emotional health, and second, by broadening the knowledge and skills of our teachers with high-quality professional training.

When we first hired a master's level behavioral specialist in 2011, we didn't know how many children would need or benefit from

her services. Now she reports that 78 percent of the children we serve have developmental delays and social-emotional concerns. We have needed to provide additional training and equip our teachers to recognize emotional and social problems commonplace in our child population, so that parents can get help and resources in a timely way to prepare children for success in school and in life.

The professional development training program will take a proactive stance by heightening teacher's awareness and sensitivity to effectively respond to areas of behavioral and emotional concern early on. In this way we can help change the course of a problem that might otherwise become lifelong.

Mission and Ministry grant requests must be endorsed by a Daughter of Charity, and Sister Pat Connolly, DC, LPC, was the principal applicant for this grant. Many thanks to her, the Social Services Department, and to the DePaul and DePaul-Wesley staff who worked together to make it happen.

There are two ways to participate. First, you can ask us to send you the name of a senior, a list of items they need, and you shop for that person.


