Dr. Guerra will receive the award during DCSSA's 12th annual luncheon on Thursday, June 8, from noon to 1:15 p.m. at the Whitley Theological Center on the campus of Oblate School of Theology, 285 Oblate Drive.

A servant-leader is someone who, like St. Vincent de Paul, first wants to serve, and is focused on the well-being of their community. Fernando A. Guerra, M.D. M.P.H., F.A.A.P., served for 23 years as director of health for the San Antonio Metropolitan Health District and has served as a clinical professor of pediatrics at the University of Texas Health Science Center. His professional career reflects a dedication to improving access to health care for infants, women, children, and the elderly. As a civic leader, he has been active in research, public health program and policy development, legislative issues, and health planning.

Dr. Guerra, who retired from practice in 2014, is married to Beverly Purcell-Guerra, a public relations professional.

Generations of Generosity: Victor and Anna Belle Leyendecker

When Victor and Anna Belle Leyendecker married in 1950, they knew that giving would always be at the forefront of their relationship and growing family.

Now, in 2017, Anna Belle has been a part of Daughters of Charity Services of San Antonio for almost one-third of her life. "My husband, Victor, grew up in a household and

family that struggled. He knew as soon as he was able to, he would give to those less fortunate, and I understood how important it was." As long-time members of the congregation of St. Pius X Catholic Church, the Leyendeckers were introduced to DCSSA through the Adopt-A-Family for Christmas Program in the late 80s. Decades later, Mrs. Leyendecker reflects on the impact it had in their lives, "Some of the families we saw were absolutely the poorest of the poor. One woman was living with her daughter in a converted garage: no bed, no bathroom of their own, nothing. When we left, Victor and I were shaken to tears."

As the family continued to contribute to the Christmas Program, they learned more about DCSSA and the needs of the south San Antonio community, including quality early childhood education and decided to give regularly. For as long as she could make them, Anna Belle would deliver hand-made blankets to the infant rooms at DePaul Children's Center.

After Victor passed away in 2005, the Victor and Anna Belle Leyendecker Fund for Children at DCSSA was established in his honor. As time passed, Anna Belle decided that she no longer needed material gifts for her birthday, anniversaries, or Mother's Day, so she told her 8 children and 14 grandchildren to instead make donations to DCSSA in her honor. And they have.

Victor and Anna Belle's family continue the tradition of giving to those in need."We chose Daughters because we saw the impact that our gifts make. I continue to give because I know
